Re: Ratification Vote Amended Constitution of Hawaii 2024

Aloha, Legislators, Officers, and Nationals of the reinstated Lawful Hawai'i Government (LHG),

I am honored to forward the Amended Constitution of Hawaii 2024. On August 18, 2024, the Legislators of the reinstated Hawai'i kingdom unanimously voted to pass the Amended Constitution of Hawai'i 2024. The process to amend the 2000 Constitution of Hawai'i was brought forward by the office of the Prime Minister at the 49th Mana Kau Kanawai Convention of the Legislative Assembly on January 19, 20, & 21st, 2024 on the Island of Oahu.

The presentation focused on why we should re-examine our Constitution of Hawai'i 2000. The first issue we examined was Article 1. The Form of Government "Direct Democratic System vs. Kingdom System." The second issue was the violation of our "Unwritten" / "Written" Ancient customs" vs. Statute law". And the third issue is the Lord Paramount "Monarch"/"Mo'i" (the indisputed sole owner of all lands) in his Hawaii kingdom. These three issues (and others) are the cornerstones of the constitutions of 1840, 1852, 1865, and 1887 (a.k.a. Bayonet constitution) preserved in perpetuity following customary international law.

After intense discussions, the Legislative Assembly requested that we continue amending the Constitution of 2000. The decision was to arrange Zoom meetings to continue the process discussions that began in February and continued to the summer. After all the amendments were completed, the next step was for the legislators to vote on the amendments to the Constitution of 2000. On August 18, 2024, the legislators voted and approved the amendments to the Constitution of 2024.

I congratulate the legislators for their courage to support the amending of the Constitution of 2000. As your seven-time elected Prime Minister, I, thank you for your support. This year is the 25th anniversary of our reinstated Hawaii kingdom and we have come a long way in sustaining our belief in acquiring our

sovereign nation status. May I'o bless us all and continue to give us the strength to justice and recognition.
